Copyright licensing for publishing articles of *Diatom* on the web

To the owners of the copyrighted articles of *Diatom*, vols. 1–24:

In the annual meeting of the Japanese Society of Diatomology held on 8 May 2010, we decided to provide our journal *Diatom* as a PDF for public use on the web. The articles will be made available online two years after their publication. The purpose of its publication on the Internet is to expand the availability of the articles and further contribute to the development of diatomology.

Our electronic archives will be published in “Journal@rchive,” supported by the Japan Science and Technology Agency. Our first step is to publish the articles of *Diatom*, vols. 1–24, online in 2012.

Currently, we are seeking permission from all the copyright owners, or first authors, and co-authors, or their heirs, of the articles to publish their work online. The articles to be available in the archives include original papers, reviews, notes, short notes, and other reports.

If you are one of the copyright owners, and you do not want your article(s) to be published in “Journal@rchive” on the web, please contact us to renounce the publication of your article(s) by February 29, 2012. Otherwise, your article(s) will be published on the web. Even if you contact us after March 2012, we will respond and withdraw your article(s) from the website as soon as possible.

The publication on the web is not intended to infringe upon any author’s copyright. Thus, we strongly encourage you to approve the publication of your article(s) in *Diatom* on the web.
